## **Summary and Conclusions of the workshop:**

The impact of Covid 19 on the rail transport, based on the presentations and round table discussions, can be summarized separately for:

- **≻**Passenger transport
  - **□**Negative impact
  - **□**Positive experiences
- >Freight transport
  - **□**Negative impact
  - **□**Positive experiences







#### Passenger transport:

- **≻Negative impact** 
  - Lockdown in most countries stopped passenger transport completely in March and April
  - After relaxing measures demand for passenger transport
     dropped about 80 85% (across the region)
  - Passenger transport showed little flexibility
- > Positive experiences
  - Online ticketing what was not possible for years happened in short period of few weeks
  - Introduction of train from Prague to Rijeka, 12 wagons –
     private initiative 12 h but with excellent catering 100% full







## Passenger transport (continued):

- >What to expect and do in the future:
  - High expectations from rail passenger transport as a sustainable
     way to travel use opportunity to attract passengers
  - Learn from good practices make rail travel attractive
    - •private initiatives line Prague Rijeka
    - •further improve accessibility (online ticketing)
    - use this window to accelerate infrastructure projects (Hungary)
  - Higher demands for financial compensations pressure to amend
     PSO contracts use money wisely
  - Use this opportunity to implement reforms (Transport Community Short Term Goals)







## **Freight transport:**

- **≻Negative impact** 
  - Average loss of rail freight revenues was about 17% (CER)
- > Positive experiences
  - Freight transport proved to be very robust moves large volumes of goods with minimal human resources
  - New type of goods consumer electronics (from road and air)
  - Reintroduced 'single wagon load' (after 20 years between Italy and Croatia)
  - Good cooperation made the freight transport running
