



# The Danube Strategy and the European Green Deal

The Danube Strategy and the European Green Deal have common priorities and challenges:

- The sustainability dimension prominent in all the MRS
- Priorities common to all the MRS: environment and climate change, connectivity, research & innovation and (sustainable) economic development - are related to key actions of the EGD
- Most of the EGD challenges can be tackled only joint efforts








## The EGD and sustainable transport

Aim of EGD: to reduce EU's greenhouse gas emissions with 90% by 2050, so where will the focus be?

- A shift to more sustainable transport modes such as rail and inland waterways
- Boost considerably the uptake of clean vehicles and alternative fuels
- Multimodal transport combining various transport modes throughout a journey
- Digital technologies enabling automated mobility and smart traffic management systems
- Urban mobility: address air quality, emissions, urban congestion and noise. These include improving public transport and promoting active modes of transport such as walking and cycling

### The EGD and TEN-T



European

TEN-T policy to contribute to and enable the achievement of the EGD through:

- Further enhancement of sustainable modes (rail, inland waterways)
- Continuous provision of alternative fuel infrastructure
- Strengthening the multi-modal network (links and nodes), allowing each mode to deploy its strengths
- Boosting integration of traditional and innovative/smart infrastructure components to enable seamless, sustainable and efficient services

# Linking it all together: EUSDR PA 1B Actions in the EUSDR Action Plan

ACTION 1: To bring to completion the **TEN-T** (rail and road) core network crossing the Danube Region, overcoming the difficulties and the bottlenecks, and taking into account environmental, economic and political challenges, particularly in the cross-border sections

ACTION 2: To support the implementation of the **Rail Freight Corridors** (RFC) forming part of the European rail network for competitive freight (Reg. 913/2010) with extension to candidate and neighbouring countries

ACTION 3: To enhance cooperation between air traffic stakeholders in order to improve regional connectivity and prepare a plan to implement shorter plane routes

ACTION 4: To ensure sustainable metropolitan transport systems and mobility

ACTION 5: To improve the **regional/ local cross-border infrastructure** and the access to rural areas by facilitating secondary and tertiary transport infrastructure

ACTION 6: To develop further nodal planning for **multimodality** 

ACTION 7: To develop further **Intelligent Traffic Systems** by using environmental-friendly technologies, especially in urban regions

ACTION 8: To raise awareness for **road safety** and encourage exchange of best practices



**C** (territorial co-operation): INTERREG Europe, ESPON 2020 Cooperation Programme

 Cohesion Fund (CF): for Member States whose Gross National Income (GNI) per inhabitant is less than 90% of EU average

## Cohesion policy 2021-2027

#### Which investments will the ERDF and CF cover?

- The two funds will invest EUR 274 billion in the EU's regions (respectively, EUR 226 billion ERDF and EUR 48 billion CF). The ERDF focuses its investments on several key priority areas, pursuant to thematic concentration: innovation and research, the digital agenda, support for small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs), environment and the net-zero-carbon economy.
- The Cohesion Fund will support environmental infrastructure and priority EU projects in Trans-European Transport Networks. It will also cover projects of energy efficiency, use of renewable energy or sustainable urban mobility presenting clear environmental benefits.



## **Cohesion policy 2021-2027**

#### Focus on **investments** in the **transport** sector:

- Making the transport system more intelligent, more climate resilient, more connected and cleaner
- For TEN-T emphasis on soft, green and digital components. Improving cross-border mobility at regional and local level, with ETC focusing in particular on transport services which require close and sustained cross-border cooperation.
- Multimodal: priority should be given to investments facilitating a shift of freight and passenger transport to rail
- Cross-border connectivity
- Intelligent transport systems (ITS)
- Sustainable urban mobility
- Road safety

#### **SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES:**

- 2. 1. Support greening the energy and transport sectors in the Danube Region by enhancing the integration of renewable energy sources.
- 2. 2. Promoting climate change adaptation capacities in the Danube Region and disaster management on transnational level in relation to environmental risks (taking into account ecosystem-based approaches).
- 2. 3. Sustainable, integrated, transnational water and sediment management in the Danube River Basin ensuring good quality and quantity of waters and sediment balance.
- 2. 4. Protecting and preserving the biodiversity in ecological corridors and eco-regions of transnational relevance in the Danube Region.



## **Specifically for accession countries**

**IPA III** (Instrument for Pre-accession Assistance): EUR 14 billion for 2021-2027, Mobilising strategic investments supporting an economy that works for people: ► Supporting transport and energy connectivity. The Economic and Investment plan for the Western Balkans

- Crowding in private investments via the External Action Guarantee of up to EUR 53.4 billion which will have the capacity to guarantee investments worldwide including in IPA beneficiaries.
- Coherence and complementarity with NDICI. Its thematic and rapid reaction components will also benefit candidate countries and potential candidates. More synergies with a wide range of EU internal policy programmes to maximise impact on key priority sectors such as security, migration, research and innovation, environment and climate action, transport and energy connectivity.

**NDICI** (European Neighbourhood Instrument): EUR 79,5 billion for 2021-2027, of which EUR 19,32 billion for the Neighbourhood:

GEOGRAPHIC PILLAR: foster dialogue and cooperation with third countries, EUR 60.39 billion

THEMATIC PILLAR support to human rights and democracy, civil society, stability and peace, EUR 6.36 billion

RAPID-RESPONSE PILLAR to rapidly and effectively intervene for conflict prevention and to respond to situations of crisis or instability, EUR 3.18 billion


